Medication Administration:

Passport Clients

Licensed nurse can administer medications up to 2x per day as medically necessary

Medication Dispenser

- Approximately \$49/month
- 10 day supply
- Family, visiting nurse, etc. fill machine
- Audio reminder
- Best for persons with mild dementia
 - MOW doesn't provide;
- Passport Clients receive as assessed

Treatments

Aides can apply if not prescription; licensed nurse needed for prescribed treatments

Checking blood sugar

• Licensed nurse need to monitor (Home Health Agency or private provider)

Pharmacy:

- Supply medications in "bubble packs"
 - All medications for particular time of day pre-packaged into sealed packs;
- Check your personal pharmacy to see if this service is offered
 - o Medicine Shoppe (740-653-7779) offers it and provide free delivery to Lancaster city;
 - Risch's (740-653-1324) offers it and provides free city delivery and county delivery on scheduled days;

Emergency response systems

- Priced per month
- Notifies contact person and/or agency if fallen
- Passport Clients as assessed may be eligible to receive
- Meals on Wheels installation and monthly monitoring fee based on income

Monitored smoke detectors

- Part of ER response system
- Needed for any dementia person
- Passport Clients as assessed may be eligible to receive

Free standing smoke detectors:

Lock boxes on door (similar to type realtors use)

Access code is provided to ER squad by dispatch en route – available at Meals on Wheels

 - Only allows callers with special code to contact person with cell phone.
 - Do Not Call list (1-888-382-1222)
 - Both land lines and cell phones;
 - Must call from the phone # you want to register
 - Wait until 4th ring to answer; program answering machine to 5 ring pick up
 - o Freeze credit line
 - Monitor bank account transactions
 - O Use a Payee:
 - Meals on Wheels;
 - 2-1-1 if have mental health diagnosis
- Reactive measures:
 - o Report cases to police/Sheriff/Attorney General

 - If landlines are d/c these devices may not work;
 - o However some ERS companies work with cell phones
- Security System

Medication Theft:

- Utilize locked medication dispenser;
- Lock box for excess medications;
- Avoid storing medications in high traffic area of house (bathroom or kitchen);
- Someone to monitor usage to ensure medications administered per schedule.
